Does this person have a condition which is affecting their ability to make a decision	
Is this person over 16	
Is this person facing a decision about <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Serious medical treatment or <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A move to another hospital for more than 28days or <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A change of residential care home for more than 8 weeks or <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subject to a care review in relation to accommodation or <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A safeguarding adults meeting (even if they have family or friends) 	
Is this person without family or friends to act on their behalf	

Please tick all boxes which apply to the person referred.

Only one issue in the large box should be ticked.

A person may still be eligible for IMCA support if they have family or friends who the decision maker has stated are inappropriate to act on their behalf. The decision maker must state the reasons for this.

An IMCA can still be asked to act even if a person's capacity has not been tested. It would be the IMCA's role to ensure this is done. If a person is deemed to have capacity the IMCA support would end
